#### INTRODUCTION

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has consistently worked to ensure quality maintenance and improvement as a crucial component of the institution's quality assurance system. 
#### DATA COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS

An online feedback form was created through **Performance Insight-360** (**PI-360**), Quality Analytics Framework and sent to the faculty. Responses were received from 21 faculty members. To arrive at comprehensive results, a useful statistical tool like percentage has been used. For effective presentation of the data, tables and graphs have been used. Questions were based on a 5-point Likert scale: 1: Strongly agree, 2: Agree, 3: Neutral, 4: Disagree and 5: Strongly disagree.

#### A. The question-wise analysis of the feedback is given below:


1. The curriculum conforms to the National Curriculum Framework as stipulated by the respective statutory bodies (UGC/NCTE/RCI).


2. The programme learning outcomes and course learning outcomes of the curriculum are well-defined.


















#### 11. The curriculum integrates well with my future academic or career goals.















#### **B.** Descriptive Feedback

Overall, the faculty is satisfied with the curriculum. 28.57 percent of the faculty strongly agreed and 71.43 percent agreed with curriculum satisfaction and delivery. However, a few suggestions for improvement have been given by the faculty:

- New topics should be added to the Pedagogy of Science. In Course 103, Teaching and Learning, sessional work can be modified as per the requirements of the course. The components of the sessional work fall under the domain of Psychology and only two are based on teaching and learning.
- 2. More Skill-based courses should be added. Alternate Assessments need to be adopted.
- 3. There is a Scope to add field trips, practical sessions and self-directed learning.
- 4. Choice-based and elective Courses need to be made more attractive.
- 5. Important papers namely, Classical Political Philosophy or Western Political Thought and Indian Political Thought are not included in the curriculum of Political Science.
- 6. There is a need to re-sequence papers in Political Science so that the core paper can be studied by those who have opted for Political Science as their Minor course.
- The learning resources provided, support the understanding of the curriculum, however, more books can be added to the library especially related to the 4 year undergraduate programmes.

### Follow-Up Action:

The analysis shall be submitted to the Principal. A meeting shall be convened by the Principal to discuss the feedback and an action taken report of the feedback shall be prepared.

The following action taken report has been prepared based on the decisions taken in the meeting:
