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MIER College of Education (Autonomous), Jammu has achieved a unique distinction of being reaccredited with “A+” Grade and a CGPA of 3.64 by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) during its third cycle of assessment. This makes the College the highest-ranking Educational Institution in the J&K State. The college also stands ranked at No. 4 in the entire country amongst all teacher education institutions which have been accredited by NAAC.



The team was impressed with the infrastructure facilities, faculty, teaching learning process, the use of ICT and after interacting with the august members of the management and their vision to take MIER College to a global level by excellent embedment of ICT in teaching learning, evaluation, training and extension.

MIER College of Education had been accredited twice earlier by NAAC with ‘A’ Grade in the years 2006 and 2012. The college shall now remain accredited for 7 years instead of 5 years as per new NAAC regulations. The NAAC Peer team had visited the institution in September 2017.

The meetings of all statutory bodies constituted as per UGC guidelines for the autonomous colleges i.e. Board of Studies, Academic Council, Finance Committee and Governing Body were conducted as per calendar. Approval for the following important matters were given by the statutory bodies:

- Starting of M.Phil. (Education) programme from the session 2017-18
- Introduction of two new six months value added programmes namely; Certificate Course in Educational Management Planning and Administration and Certificate Course in Guidance and

Counselling in the college from the session 2017 and onwards.

- Adoption of revised syllabi and courses of study for M.Ed., M.A Education with Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Now it adoption of revised syllabi and courses of study for B.Ed. for the session 2016-18.
- Panel of paper setters for the different examination to be conducted by the College.
- Creation of Result Review Committee to oversee the quality of results.
- Fixation of new fee structure for different courses

INCLUSIVE SCHOOL

A wide range of activities were introduced by the Inclusive School this year to make its functioning more effective and innovative.

- New modified curriculum based on differentiated instruction and assessment plans were given to each student as per his/her Individual needs.
- Resource Room services were provided after school hours to all students having learning difficulties.
- Students were encouraged to participate in Annual Day, Sports Day and other events to instil confidence in them. They were also awarded with medals and certificates.

- A number of students from different colleges of education also visited the Inclusive School. They interacted with students and were impressed with facilities and programme being offered.

- Physiotherapy facilities were also provided on campus to all students. A Pre-Vocational Set up was also created for the students so that they could learn skills like: identifying and sorting currency, time telling, laundry sorting, buttoning/ unbuttoning, zipping/unzipping clothes, tying shoe laces etc.



STRENGTHENING TEACHER EDUCATION



A one-day national seminar on “Strengthening Teacher Education: Challenges and Strategies” was organized by MIER College of Education (Autonomous) in collaboration with the Council for Teacher Education, J&K Chapter on October 1, 2016. Prof. Ashok Aima, Vice Chancellor, Central University of Jammu inaugurated the seminar which was attended by eminent educationists, high officials of CTE, research scholars, faculty and students from colleges and universities not only from J&K but from different parts of the country. More than 55 papers were presented during the sessions.

Dr. Arun K Gupta, Chairman, MIER, in his welcome address, said that there was a great need to strengthen the system by deliberating on the issues and challenges which are road blockers in achieving maximum benefits from the modified curricula and share strategies and innovations for desired

outcomes. Dr. Renu Gupta, Director, MIER dwelt upon the themes of the seminar.

Keynote addresses were delivered by Prof. R.G. Kothari Former Vice Chancellor & Chief Advisor; C.T.E; Prof. Amit Kauts Head & Dean, Dept. of Education, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar; Prof. Kirandeep Kaur Prof. and Dean Head, Department of Education, Punjabi University, Patiala and Dr. Hemant Lata Sharma, Professor & Dean, Dept. of Education, M.D. University, Rohtak. The panel discussion session was chaired by Dr Lokesh Koul, Prof. Emeritus and Former Dean Faculty of Education, HP University, Shimla and the panelists included Prof. Kirandeep Kour, Prof. Mubarak Singh, Dept. of Education, University of Jammu, Prof. N.R. Sharma, Dean Academics, MIER College of Education and Dr. K.K.Sharma, Chairperson, CTE, Haryana.



CONTEMPORARY REFORMS ON TEACHER EDUCATION

Under the prestigious Sh. H.L. Gupta Memorial Lecture series, the lecture for the year 2017 was delivered by Prof. S. K. Panda, former Chairperson, National Council for Teacher Education and presently Professor at IGNOU on the topic 'Contemporary Reforms on Teacher Education' on March 26, 2017. Prof Lokesh Koul, Prof Emeritus and former Dean and Head, PG Department of Education, HP University, Shimla presided over the proceedings.

In his lecture, Prof Panda deliberated upon the contemporary reforms in education like: choice based credit system, vocational training and skill development, use of ICT in learning, online learning, evidence-based teaching strategies and ranking of educational institutions. He said these reforms can only yield promising results if teacher education programmes implement quality changes in their curriculum by bridging the gap between theory and practice, integrating human values and life skills, incorporating interdisciplinary and multilingual approach and introducing courses like yoga and inclusive education. Prof. Panda also highlighted the significance of constructivism in teaching learning.



EXTENSION LECTURE

TEACHER EDUCATION: ISSUES AND PROBLEMS



An extension lecture on the theme “Teacher Education: Issues and Problems” was delivered on March 28, 2017 by Prof. S.K. Yadav, Former Head, Department of Teacher Education, NCERT and currently, Consultant at NCTE, New Delhi.

Prof. Yadav deliberated on the issues and concerns in teacher education programmes such as gap between theory and practice, curriculum structure, working of teacher education institutions, assessment and examination etc.

The lecture was followed by an interactive session with the students and faculty members.

VALUE CREATION FOR MAJOR STAKEHOLDER IN EDUCATION

Mr. Gautam Mahajan, President Inter-link and Customer Value Foundation, New Delhi delivered a lecture in September, 2016. Mr. Mahajan highlighted the need for value creation among students and teachers. He said that teachers should go beyond imparting knowledge and create value by showing the student how the knowledge is used by others, what they do with the knowledge, and how the student can use knowledge to their benefit to improve the quality of life. Mr. Mahajan observed that students should change their mindsets to enable them to think outside the box and be agents of change.



MENTAL HEALTH AND DRUG DE-ADDICTION ISSUES

Dr. Gurmeet Kour, Head, Drug De-addiction and Mental Health Centre, Police Headquarters Jammu, J&K held an interactive session with the students on April 19, 2017 regarding "De Addiction and Mental Health issues. She administered two questionnaires to measure the stress and happiness quotient of the audience. Dr. Kour demonstrated relaxation techniques to manage stress. She also talked about another burning issue in the society namely consumption of drugs by youth. She described the symptoms of drug addiction in youth and highlighted the strategies for de addiction.



RESEARCH AND TEACHING

Prof. Jigar Mohammad, Dean Research, University of Jammu delivered an extension lecture on the topic "Research and Teaching" on September 16, 2017. He observed that teaching is a highly professional activity which demands specialized knowledge, research skills and scientific temper. He urged the students to develop scientific attitude towards research. A lively interaction with audience followed the lecture.



CENTER FOR EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH (CER)

The following activities were organized by the center:

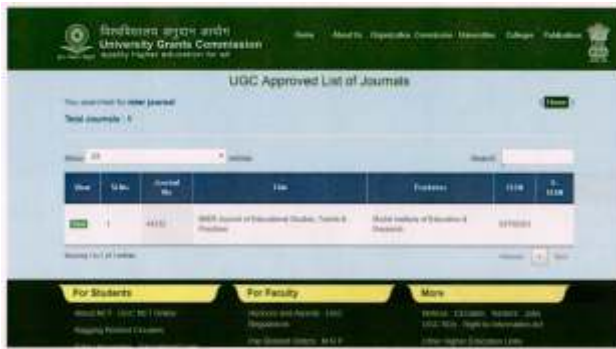
A research colloquium on the topic “Comparative Situational Analysis of J&K and other Selected States of India with Reference to Special Education and Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Intellectual Disability” on March 18, The resource person was Dr. Rohnika Sharma, HoD Department of Special Education, MIER College. She highlighted the impact and implementation of special education and rehabilitation policies and services in the states of J&K, Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh. She emphasized the need for J&K state government to formulate its own disability policy in accordance with the needs of the people with disabilities and organize awareness and training camps for them.



Dr. Bindu Dua, Assistant Professor PG Department of Education was the resource person in the research colloquium on the topic “A Critical Study of Educational Philosophy of Bal Gangadhar Tilak.” She highlighted the socio-economic and political, conditions prevailing in the country during Tilak's life time. She also highlighted Tilak's philosophy of education which was focused on the inculcation of patriotic, moral and spiritual values, national and social integration, vocational efficiency, education for salvation, development of physical abilities.

The seventh edition of MIER Journal of Educational Studies, Trends and Practices (MJESTP) has been published. Over these years, MJESTP has been able to create linkages among researchers in a number of countries and has, thereby, served as an important platform for sharing researches, innovative practices and trends in the field of education. The journal enjoys high international ranking in terms of its impact factor (4.002), coverage and standards has also received the 12OR Publication Excellence Award for the year 2017. MJESTP now stands approved by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and it has been included in the list of approved journals. The Journal is regarded as an important initiative by the college in the field of education and enjoys high reputation among the practitioners of education worldwide.

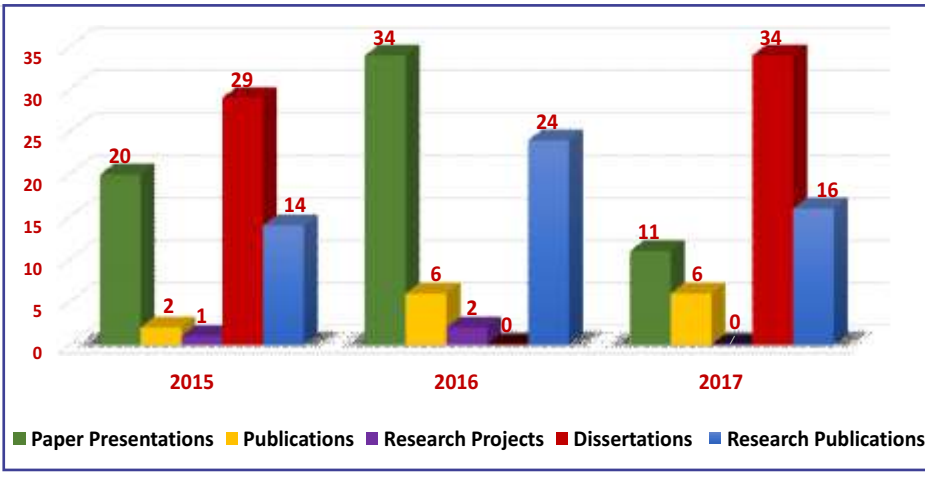

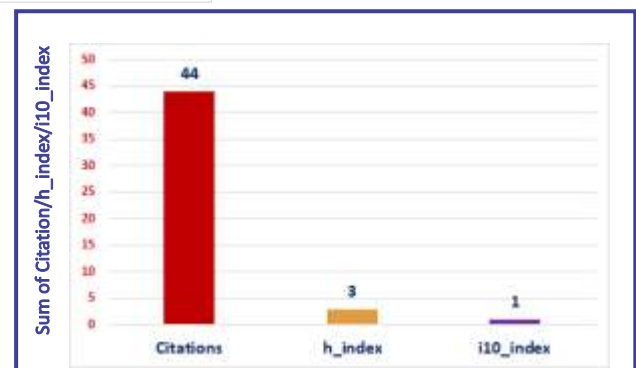

CENTRE FOR EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY (CET)

The center organized the following activities :-



- A two-day training programme on the theme 'Use of Google Classroom and MIER College App' from October 14 to 15, for faculty and students of the PG Department. The training programme focused on online tests, assignments and dissemination of information using Google Classroom.



- A sensitization programme to encourage digital monetary transaction 'Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyan (VISAKA)' initiated by the Ministry of Human Resource Development on 20th December.
- A workshop to orient the faculty and students on the functioning of the software Academia ERP for collection, storage and retrieval of academic information, marking of attendance, payment of fees and examination processes etc was organized by on 22nd December .

Installation of nineteen new closed circuit cameras in the classrooms, libraries, auditorium, corridors and multipurpose hall respectively at a cost of 1.5 lacs for strengthening surveillance process.



- Workshops to train student in the use of ICT such as Smart Class and Interactive White Boards in the teaching-learning process were organised on May 11,2017. The facility was extended to the students of Govt. College of Education, Canal Road under the MOU.



- To celebrate the Technology Day a programme on "Google Classroom and other Facilities using G Suit" was organized on 11 May 2017.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The IQAC remained very busy in preparing documents and reports in connection with the third cycle of the accreditation by the NAAC.

A number of activities were organized in collaboration with the Govt. College of Education and the Model Institute of Education and Technology (MIET):

- Annual joint review meeting with the Govt. College of Education was held on March 1, 2017 to further the collaborations on different academic, professional and extension activities in teacher education.
- The linkage with Model Institute of Engineering and Technology (MIET) helped in developing choice based credit system in M.A. Education and M.Ed.
- New modules namely Alumni Dashboard, Student Dash board in Pi360 Analytic Software, developed at MIET, has also been provided to the college under the MoU.
- Senior faculty members of MIET were also associated as members of the Governing body, Academic Council, Board of Studies and Advisory committee of the IQAC the of the college.
- As part of the regular ISO 9001:2008 standards a team of internal auditors conducted the audits from 24th-25th October. External audit of the college was conducted on 21st Nov. under the ISO 9001:2008 standards. No corrective and preventive actions were reported by the auditors.
- The IQAC collected online feedback from trainees, faculty and non-teaching staff on the functioning of the college. The feedback was analyzed and suggestions given by the major stakeholders were used for bringing improvement.
- Based on 360 degree feedback and the training need analysis, orientation cum training programme were organized for faculty, Non teaching staff and students on important topics namely NAAC Accreditation, ISO 9001:2015, How to do Digital Transactions, Academic and Administrative Audits, How to Frame Question Paper, Utilization of Library Resources, Roles and Responsibilities of Class IV Employees etc.

ENVIRONMENT UNIT

The following activities were conducted by the unit :

The unit celebrated the “Earth Day” on April 22, 2017 by organising cleanliness campaign in the campus. The students participated in the process of preparing organic manure by using dry leaves and weeds collected in the cleanliness drive. A plantation drive was also carried out.

EXTENSION UNIT

The unit adopted a village named Bhatiyari near Bishnah, Jammu Distt for organizing various outreach and community building programmes. A survey was conducted on Jan. 21, 2017 by students to assess the demographic structure, literacy rate, socio-economic status, issues and challenges faced by the residents of the village. The analysis of the survey helped in planning and implementing need-based awareness programmes, campaigns and workshops. The activities conducted included:

A workshop on the theme “Child Malnutrition” on February 21st, 2017 in which a group of about 25 student members of Extension Unit made the villagers aware about need of balanced diet. They also distributed flyers containing information on the causes and preventions of malnutrition.



World Health Day was celebrated on April 8, 2017 in collaboration with Ayush Medical Center (Indian System of Medicine, Samba).

27 inhabitants were diagnosed with different ailments Free medicines were also distributed among them.

Dr. Anil Sharma of Ayush conducted a practical session on yoga and also deliberated on its benefits where as Dr. Arun Gupta of Ayush gave a lecture on the topic “Common Health Issues”.

A meeting with the Sarpanch and Panches of the adopted village was held on August 17, 2017.

The meeting was held to discuss various problems which are being faced by the villagers and how the college can provide assistance in solving them.



NSS UNIT

The NSS Unit of the college organized a number of activities during the year under the aegis of All India NSS Programme and the Programme Officer of NSS, University of Jammu.

- A Fund-raising Campaign, a Rangoli Making Competition, and On the Spot Patriotic Song Competition marked the celebrations of “National Integration Week” from November 19 to 24, 2016.
- To commemorate the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, the “National Youth Day” was celebrated. 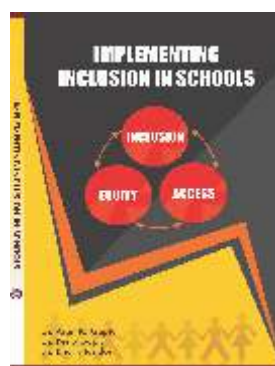
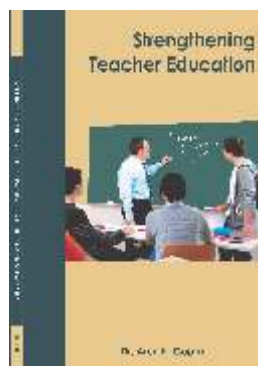
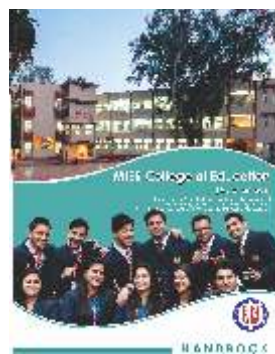
